Speaker Bio: William L. Koch, DDS, received an A.B. from Dartmouth College and received his dental training at the University of Iowa. During his career he has taken over 2200 hours of continuing education, focusing on the restoration of severely debilitated mouths, periodontics, implants, and the treatment of dental-related facial pain. He is a Pankey Scholar, a former Teaching Assistant and Advisor at the Pankey Institute, and is an AGD Master. His areas of professional interest are porcelain veneers, dental implants, periodontal surgery, complex oral reconstruction, and cast gold restorations. He is member of the American Dental Association, the Academy of General Dentistry, and the Academy of Fixed Prosthodontics. He is also the current Vice-Chair of the Vermont Board of Dental Examiners.



Course Description:

Creativity is the secret sauce of successful treatment planning. One can give a data set to fifty dentists and none of the treatment plans will be identical. There is only one correct diagnosis, but there is not true "optimal" approach to care. The presentation section will cover the initial patient interview and triage, examination and data collection as a patient-specific process, analysis, and the development of an appropriate care plan. The second day will feature two cases for open discussion of the treatment planning aspects of each case.

Dr. L.D. Pankey was often quoted as saying, "I never saw a set of teeth walk into my office." Successful treatment is built on understanding each patient as an individual. The best plan isn't always the most complex or the most esthetically impressive. Rather, it is the one that meets the patient exactly where he or she is and provides a continuum of care as the relationship progresses.

Course Objectives:

- Gain a practical sense of what diagnostics are needed for each patient
- Learn why CR is important and when it isn't
- See how simple photography can often make life easier
- Understand the continuum of relationship-based treatment planning and why treatment plans evolve over time
- Find creative ways to solve difficult problems
- Become comfortable fitting treatment to the person and not the textbook
